



Author Spotlight: Kat Karpenko, The Photograph 1930's Ukrainian Terror Famine

Saturday, August 17, 11 - 1 pm

Join us for a special reading by local author, **Kat Karpenko**. *The Photograph* is an historical novel about a Ukrainian family dealing with Holodomor, the terror-famine of 1932-33.

The Photograph is a novel based on a photograph of my grandparents' departure from Ukraine in 1928 when the family gathered to say goodbye. I do not know what happened to the 2 brothers and 4 sisters in the photo so I created a story about the departure and about what might have happened to these people using facts from historical research and from survivors' accounts of the genocide orchestrated by Stalin known as Holodomor, death by starvation. This little-known history explains much about what is happening in Ukraine today. The novel explains much about the strong will to survive of the Ukrainian people.

NEW RELEASES

July 2024

The Lion Women of Tehran by Marjan Kamali (02 July) In 1950s Tehran, Ellie lives in comfort until the death of her father forces Ellie and her mother to move to a tiny home downtown. Lonely, Ellie dreams of a friend. Luckily, on the first day of school, she meets Homa, a kind girl with a brave spirit. Together they play, learn to cook, and share their ambitions. But their happiness is disrupted when Ellie and her mother return to their previous life. Now a popular student, Ellie's memories of Homa begin to fade. Years later her sudden reappearance in Ellie's world alters the course of both of their lives. But as the political turmoil in Iran builds, one betrayal will have enormous consequences.

Masquerade by OO Sangoyomi (02 July)
Timbuktu has been conquered by the warrior king of Yorùbáland. Already shunned, living conditions for Òdòdó and the other women in her guild grow even worse under Yorùbá rule. Then Òdòdó is abducted; whisked away to Ṣàngótṣ, where she discovers that her kidnapper is none other than the king, and he has chosen her to be his wife. In a change of fortune, Òdòdó soars to the very heights of society. But after a lifetime of subjugation, the power of this world becomes too enticing to resist. As tensions grow, Òdòdó must defy the king she's been forced to wed, re-forging the loyalties of the court in her favor or risk losing everything

Bury Your Gays by Chuck Tingle (09 July)
Misha is a jaded scriptwriter who has been working in
Hollywood for years, and has just been nominated for his
first Oscar. But when he's pressured by his producers to
kill off a gay character in the upcoming season
finale—"for the algorithm"—Misha discovers that it's not
that simple. As he is haunted by his past, and past
mistakes, Misha must risk everything to find a way to do
what's right—before it's too late.

Navigational Entanglements by Aliette deBodard (30 July) Using the power of Shadows generated from their own bodies' vitality, Navigators guide space ships safely across a realm populated by dangerous creatures called Tanglers. In return for their service, the navigator clans get wealth and power-but they get the blame, too. So when a Tangler escapes and goes missing, the empire calls on the clans to deal with it. Viêt Nhi is not good with people, but when her elders send her on a joint-clan mission to locate the escaped Tangler, she can't say no. Hac Cúc of the Snake clan usually likes people. It says so on her "information gathering", right after "poisoning" and "stabbing". But when their imperial envoy is found dead by poison, this crew of expendable apprentices will have to learn to work together before they end up in a iail cell while the Tangler wreaks havoc on the city.

August 2024

The Mercy of Gods by James SA Corey (02 August) Caught up in academic intrigue and affairs of the heart, Dafyd Alkhor is pleased to be an assistant to a brilliant scientist and his research team. Then the Carryx ships descend, decimating the humans and taking the best and brightest of Anjiin society away to the Carryx homeworld, Dafyd along with them. They are dropped in the middle of a struggle they barely understand, set in a competition against the other captives with extinction as the price of failure. Only Dafyd and a handful of his companions see past the contest to the deeper game that they must play to survive: learning to understand, and manipulate, the Carryx themselves.

The Seventh Veil of Salome by Silvia Moreno-Garcia (06 Aug) 1950s Hollywood: Every actress wants to play Salome, the role in a big-budget movie about the legendary woman. When the film's director casts Vera Larios, in the lead role, she quickly becomes the talk of the town. Vera also becomes an object of envy for Nancy Hartley, who will do anything to win fame. Two actresses, both determined to make it in Hollywood, make for a sizzling combination. But this is the tale of three women; it is also the story of the princess Salome herself, consumed with desire for the prophet who foretells the doom of Herod: a woman torn between duty and the yearning of her heart.

Confounding Oaths by Alexis Hall (27 Aug) 1815: Mr. John Caesar is determined for his sister, Mary, to have a successful coming out. Despite his best efforts, he is thwarted by the various interventions of a ragtag regiment of soldiers, a mysterious military cult, and a malicious fairy godmother. When Mary is cursed by the fair folk, Mr. Caesar is forced to work with the working-class Captain James to rescue her. While Mr. Caesar is no stranger to dallying with soldiers, he's never expected one to stay. Or wanted one to. But even if the captain felt the same, he and Mr. Caesar come from different worlds. And other worlds are the last thing either of them want to be dealing with...

The Knowing by Tanya Talaga (27 Aug) It is believed that nearly 20,000 Indigenous children have been lost on Turtle Island; neglected, medically experimented on, abused, murdered. This is one of Canada's greatest open secrets. Generations of Indigenous People have known that their family members disappeared, with no answers. The system, fuelled by Church and state, committed acts of sexually, physically and emotionally abusing children over decades, many of whom died and were buried on the grounds of the schools. In 2021, the discovery of 215 graves made international headlines. Canada's quiet horror became its very loud, public disaster. Tanya Talaga retells the history of this country as only she can.
